Special Literacy Project: Chapter books (in lots of 20) for 3rd Grade classes to read at North Elementary School in the Jefferson School District (homeless students).

Ongoing Projects: MCCC Annual Scholarship, Fairview Support, Paula’s House Support, Habitat Showers, PJ Party for Sunrise House, Blue Hat Community Service Project: (handmade blue fleece hats for organizations such as Cary Chapel Church in Monroe who received 35 warm blue fleece hats for their Thanksgiving Care packages), Birthday Boxes at Oaks Victory Village.

Partnership Projects: Altrusa partners with AAUW for the PJ Party for Sunrise House as well as the Allies in Monroe (AIM) program at Monroe High School that mentor students and helps prepare them for a post-secondary education. Looking for opportunities to partner with other non-profits.

Current International Project: "Days for Girls" giving back days of dignity, health, and opportunity thru menstrual health solutions and education. Personal hygiene packets are created and distributed overseas thru the “Days for Girls” organization. Monroe took on this project in 2016. Region 5 conference has discussed and adopted “Days for Girls” in 2018 plus international has done the same. Monroe Club is on the cusp of what is happening globally with this project

Proposed Project in Development: “We’ve Got Your Back – Lifting Up Homeless Students” Discussion circled the issue of middle school and high school homeless students being underserved. Personal hygiene items are very important to this age group. They do not want to stand out from other students. Hair care, deodorant, cologne, moisturizer, socks, hand cream. Altrusa International of Mansfield OH was the Leola M. Heiss Long-Term Service Project Award winner 2018 for this effort. Monroe Club wishes to determine scope for a similar project in our community. On our annual schedule to discuss in October 2018.
