On January 12, four Altrusans – – used their “culinary” talents to make dinner for Ronald McDonald House guests. The menu included Chicken Tortilla Soup and Dolly Parton Coconut Cupcakes. Below is the recipe for the soup – yum, yum ... delicious.

### Chicken Tortilla Soup

- |  |                                    |
|--|------------------------------------|
| 1 - 10 oz can chicken broth                              | 1 – 10oz can cream of chicken soup |
| 1 - 10 oz can cream of potato soup                       | 1 ½ cups milk                      |
| 2 cans shredded chicken                                  | 1 - 11oz can Mexicorn              |
| 1 can chopped green chilies                              | 1 large can sliced mushrooms       |
| 1 bunch green onions, sliced                             | 1½ cups shredded Cheddar cheese    |
| 4 or 5 flour tortillas, cut in thin strips               |                                    |
| 1 - 8 oz jar salsa (mild, medium, hot – your preference) |                                    |

Mix all ingredients, except tortillas strips and cheese in large pot. Bring to a boil; add tortilla strips. Reduce heat and simmer for 10 minutes. Add cheese; stir until melted. Add salsa.

## SCAMS AND FRAUD

On 24 January 2023 Sheriff Rob Streck talk to Dayton Altrusans on Scams and Fraud and how to keep ourselves and our loved ones safe from becoming a victim. A couple of points from this presentation:

- The Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office **NEVER CALLS RESIDENTS** and threatens arrest for unpaid fines, warrants, missed court dates, etc. Residents who may receive calls such as these should hang up and report it to their local police department.
- Sheriff Rob Streck stated his office has received complaints from people saying they have received calls from companies like Apple, stating their phone has been hacked. The victim was then instructed to purchase gift cards and to send the hacker information, including credit card information. In other calls, residents are asked to provide a money order or purchase a gift card to various stores for payment. **DO NOT DO THESE THINGS**. These scammers are very convincing and while in hindsight it may be easy to blame the victims, please keep in mind that these ruthless scammers are very successful at targeting people from all walks of life and age groups,” Sheriff Rob Streck said. “Please take extreme caution and only purchase directly from reputable companies. If you are a victim of fraud, contact your local police department to report it.”


