






# Reading Rainbow Program Update

As part of our club's response to the International "One Book at a Time" literacy challenge to distribute one million books and/or one million service hours during the 2021-2023 biennium, our club created the "Reading Rainbow" program, in which we distribute free books at five local Primary Health Solutions health care facilities in the Dayton, Middletown, Oxford, and Hamilton areas. The end goal of the "One Book at a Time" challenge is to enhance the lives of others. "The simple gift of a book to a child who has never had one can help eradicate illiteracy and give these children a chance to succeed in life."



We exceeded our club's goal of 500 donated books in our first month of our progra!. As of May 8, 2023, we have donated 4532 books! Even though the "One Book at a Time" Biennium Challenge is ending this month, our club has chosen to continue our local program indefinitely. Thanks to Half Price Books of Fairfield, purchased books an international grant received last year, and other generous donations, we continue to have a steady flow of books to fill our bookcases at the clinics. The staff at the clinics consistently tell us the books are very popular with both the children and adults. The kids even take them to the examination room, and it helps them stay occupied while they wait for the doctor!



### HAMILTON HIGH SCHOOL ASTRA CLUB

We are thrilled to learn that two students from our Hamilton High School ASTRA Club won ASTRA International scholarships to begin their collegiate studies: Vaishnavi Venagala (Past President 2022-23, President 2021-2022) earned a \$2000 Scholarship and Chloe Christen (Vice President 2022-2023, Membership Chair 2021-2022) earned a \$1000 scholarship. According to club advisor, Dr. Candi Pierce Garry, these students were instrumental in reviving ASTRA after the pandemic shutdown. Congratuations to these students and all the Hamilton High School ASTRA Club members for a great year!

The following summary from Candi, was shared at our recent District Five Conference:

ASTRA was started at Hamilton High in 2008 under the advisor Zellene Miller. ASTRA was a very successful club and Zellene helped guide them until her retirement. For the next couple of years, ASTRA went through a few advisors, and went inactive during COVID.

In 2021, students Chloe Christen and Vaishnavi Vengala worked to revive the club, and Dr. Candi Pierce Garry, librarian at Hamilton High School and the parent of two former ASTRA students, agreed to be the advisor. Kathy Jackson, Hamilton Altrusan and long time HHS ASTRA liaison, continued to represent Altrusa and assist the ASTRA chapter as needed. Due to the changing nature of high school with many students taking college courses off campus, our demographics had changed considerably, and during our first year (2021-2022) we didn't have any senior members! In response, we decided to open the club to freshman for the first time (freshman attend a separate campus) and many freshmen joined ASTRA that year.

Our successes were many. During the first year we established relationships with our elementary schools as well as many organizations in the community, which gave our students ample and varied volunteering opportunities. In our elementary schools, our students assisted with classroom preparation, providing childcare at Parent Teacher Organization meetings, and helping with school dances, carnivals, and seasonal events. These were their favorite volunteering experiences. In the community we helped in a variety of capacities at Operation Pumpkins, helped run a Thanksgiving 5K, served food at the Christkindlmarkt, organized books at the local library, and planted trees and helped with cleanup at our local park district. In addition, many students sought out volunteering opportunities on their own, helping their cultural centers and religious organizations with their needs. During the second year, students volunteered in all those capacities and more. Dr. Candi Pierce Garry joined Altrusa over the summer and immediately wrote and won an Altrusa grant for the ASTRA club. The students are currently working on their first literacy based service project entitled My Own Book. Working with Reading is Fundamental (RIF) they earned another grant from RIF and doubled their money. In May, they will be giving a free book to each child in Pre-K through 6<sup>th</sup> grade in two of our elementary schools who have high numbers of English Language learners. The ASTRA members also wowed the Hamilton Altrusans when they volunteered at our recent fundraising auction: selling and boxing baked goods, serving lunch, and modeling the items for auction, ultimately delivering the items to the winning bidders.

Candi Pierce Garry is beyond proud of our ASTRA members who work tirelessly in service of others. She consistently gets glowing reports and heartfelt gratitude from the groups our students serve, praising our students' character and work ethic. We are proud to have such dedicated high school members, and also pleased that we can provide a club where these students can learn and grow and make good friends while gaining valuable service and leadership experience. Having two winners of the ASTRA International Scholarship was the icing on the cake of an outstanding year for ASTRA, and a well-deserved honor for these two hard working students who are determined to leave their world better than they found it.
